January 22, 2023 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

IS 8:23-9:3; PS 27:1, 4, 13-14; 1 COR 1:10-13, 17; MT 4:12-23



Today's readings remind us that stewardship is not just a thing we do – rather, stewardship is at the core of who we are as disciples of Christ. Our first reading, from Isaiah, contains this prophecy of

Christ and what His saving message would mean to all who embrace it. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." We are among those blessed people on whom the light of Christ has shone. By virtue of our Baptism, we, who were once in the darkness of original sin, have been reborn into the great light that is God's grace in us. We are cherished members of God's family. What a privilege! Yet, with this privilege comes the responsibility to actually live for God as His good stewards to bring His Good News to all those we meet – at work, at school, in our community and right in our own home.

And there is a certain urgency that comes with the call to a stewardship way of life as we see in our Gospel passage from Matthew. Jesus says, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." In other words, turn away from selfishness, turn towards God and live as His disciple now - don't wait! In this same passage, the first disciples give us examples of a good steward's prompt "yes" when the Lord called to them. Our Lord invites them to "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men." They did not hesitate but "at once they left their nets and followed him." They put our Lord and His will first. This is the essence of a stewardship way of life – to always be ready for the ways that our Lord is calling us to bring His light to others. Do I put God's kingdom ahead of any other goals or ambitions? Do I use my talents, skills, and energy to serve my family, parish and community for God's kingdom? Do I spend my money and use my material possessions to glorify God? We too are offered a glorious mission in service of our Lord and His kingdom. What will our response be?



WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

- FEBRUARY 11

Earlier this week, the Vatican released *Pope Francis'* message for the 31st World Day of the Sick, celebrated each year on February 11, the liturgical memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. The Holy Father's message is entitled: "Take care of him" - Compassion as a synodal exercise of healing. In light of the Church's synodal journey, Pope Francis invites us "to reflect on the fact that it is precisely through the experience of fragility and illness that we can learn to walk together according to God's style of closeness, compassion and tenderness." The World Day of the Sick resonates well with the recent CCCB publication on palliative care entitled *Horizons of Hope* which highlights the Compassionate Community approach. It is a good opportunity to encourage the faithful to discover this program at the local level. In addition, the CCCB Office for Family and Life has gathered and developed some resources to promote the World Day. A Google Drive folder is now available to support communications in our diocese/parish. The folder includes the CCCB press release that will be issued later today, the Holy Father's message, a video on the experience of accompanying a loved one through palliative care, graphics for social media and prayers for families and parishes.

This year's Catholic Independent Schools theme is Seeking Truth, Healing, and Reconciliation and together, with over 22,000 students enrolled in 79 Catholic schools throughout the province, we celebrate the ways Catholic schools create environments where our Catholic story is shared and celebrated.

The Nelson Diocese currently enrolls 1238 students in 7 schools located in Penticton, West Kelowna, Kelowna, Trail, Nelson, and Cranbrook. During this special week student learning will be highlighted, our many accomplishments will be celebrated, and we honor all those staff members, parents, Council and Parent Group members, and pastors, who have contributed to our schools' level of excellence. These activities will indeed look somewhat different than in past years due to the COVID-19 restrictions.

Our sincere thanks are extended to the many parishioners throughout the diocese for their ongoing support of Catholic Education through volunteer activities, donations, financial assistance. We continue to ask for your prayers for our schools, our parishes, and our Diocese. 
