O Holy Night...The Stars are brightly shining

My first Christmas was a difficult one. Edmonton cold almost killed me. I almost lost my ears. I remembered seeing the snow flakes for the first time. It felt like a wonderful world. In the midst of the challenges of first Christmas - without family, lonely, I felt something of the love of God in snow. The snow flakes were all in different shapes and sizes.

The truth is: we all have hard lives; Christmas is the celebration of God dwelling with us in the midst of it all. As the snow flakes are different, so we are: unique, irrepeatable, filled with the goodness, love and beauty of God, and with our own unique challenges.

As the bells ring, as we follow the star, let us meet the Christ Child in a manger, with all of our lives: O Come Let us Adore Him. Jesus says: "I stand at the door of your heart knocking, if you open the door, I will come in and have supper with you" (Revelation 3:20)

Bishop Bittman in his Christmas letter wrote: "Every Christmas, we read about the star that led the three Wise Men to Jesus. In the times past and even today, stars serve as beacons to guide people on their way. In a world where it is becoming more and more difficult to navigate, we need to remember that we have Jesus, The Star' God sent us, to help guide and steer us on our life journey. May Jesus, our 'Star,' shine brightly in your hearts and in your lives, not only to guide you, but also so that you too will be stars for others, especially for those who have lost their way"

My prayer is that at Christmas Mass, especially at Holy Communion, we will experience deeply the love of the Father for us personally. See how much love the Father has for us that He sent us His Son, Jesus (John 3:16)

Christmas is a time of joy, love, hope, faith and peace. From my heart to yours; from my family to yours: May you experience the joy, love, hope, faith and peace that Jesus brings.
