December 17, 2023 Third Sunday of Advent

<u>IS 61:1-2A, 10-11; LK 1:46-50, 53-54; 1 THES 5:16-24; JN 1:6-8, 19-28</u>

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word, meaning "rejoice." The Christian steward should be characterized by a spirit of rejoicing.



Our First Reading, from Isaiah, expresses a fitting motto for us. "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." It is God Who is the source of our joy and contentment — not things or achievements or comfort, but our relationship with God.

This is why stewards can share so freely of their time, talents and material possessions — because ultimately, we are not attached to these things. We recognize them as good gifts from our loving Father, but we are attached to the Giver of the gifts, not the gifts themselves. This allows for great freedom in life and the capacity for great joy in the Lord.

In fact, we can become like John the Baptist, in today's Gospel passage from the Book of John. We read this description of the prophet: "He came for testimony, to testify to the light... He was not the light but came to testify to the light." This is our calling too — to testify to the Light, our wonderful Savior — by the way we make use of the time, talent and treasure He has entrusted to our care.

When God Himself is the source of our joy, it cannot be taken away from us. There is still time, this Advent season, to clear away any "clutter" in our lives that may take our focus away from Him. Let us strive to detach from any of these things so that we can be free to truly rejoice in God on Christmas Day.

- 1) With the camera on your phone, place the QR code in the center.
- 2) A yellow "Square Link" box will appear, touch that.
- 3) It will take you to an ST EDWARD'S site where you can donate. When requested, use "Sunday Collection" as the reason for the donation. Follow the prompts (it should be relatively simple) and pay with your credit card.
- 4) When complete, you will get a text or an email to confirm your donation.
- 5) NOTE: Because you have to include your name and address during the process, you WILL get a tax receipt for your donation.
- 6) NOTE: This is an encrypted system and has been used with success AND privacy in numerous places before (including churches).

OTHER WAYS TO DONATE: Pre-Authorized debit forms are available by email or mail if you are interested in signing up for donations through the SAG program. Email or call the office 250-766-3146 for more information. Another way you can donate is to use an eTransfer from your online banking. All you have to do is create a new "payee" (eg. St.

Edward Parish) and use the

email etransfer.stedwardswinfield@nelsondiocese.org. In the message box indicate that you want your donation to go to Sunday Collection. Regular offering envelopes will CONTINUE to be collected at Offertory at each mass. THE FOUR WEEKS OF ADVENT

During the first two weeks of Advent we light the first two purple candles. The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day is almost over. Rose is a liturgical color that is used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle on the third Sunday of Advent.

Then on the fourth Sunday of Advent, the final purple candle is lit to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait expectantly for the soon-coming birth of the King of Kings.

- The **1st Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The **2nd Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- The 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The **4th Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Parish Christmas Confessions - Monday, December 20 at 5.30pm

Rejoice Always Pray Without Ceasing

This Sunday is called *Gaudate Sunday*, that is Sunday of rejoicing. We are more than half way to Christmas and we are invited to rejoice because Jesus is near.

How is it possible to rejoice always? There's a lot that happens in life that often takes away our joy. But the liturgy gives an imperative: rejoice!

True joy is not determined by the changing circumstances of life but is a gift from the One who does not change: my Father in heaven. I can rejoice always when I place myself beneath the gaze of my Father who loves me. I don't have to do and achieve and have more than everyone else. I just have to BE, not DO. The secret of rejoicing is to rest beneath the gaze of the Father who says to me: 'Your worth is not measured by what you do; you are worth the death of my Son. I rejoice because the Father delights and rejoices in me and there is never a time He ceases to rejoice in me. You are made in His image and likenesses. That is our true identity, and the reason we rejoice: not because life is perfect but because we have a Father who is perfect, who is good and faithful.

Confession is a time to reclaim my identity as the beloved of the Father. A good Confession ends with great rejoicing as the Father Himself says: 'Let us celebrate because my child is home.'

I invite you to come so we can celebrate the love and mercy of our Heavenly Father. With hearts made clean, our Church will be so beautiful on Christmas Day because we have prepared the way for Him interiorly.

Something for me to rejoice about this Sunday. Fr. Biju passed his road test. Yoohoo! :) Thank you for praying for him.
