June 22, 2025 The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

I am the living bread of heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats of this bread will live forever.

John 6, 51

GN 14:18-20; PS 110:1-4;1 COR 11:23-26; LK 9:11B-17

Today we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This beautiful feast celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, which the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches is the source and summit of our Christian faith. "For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC paragraph 1324).

The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude" and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, it is God — the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "The Lord Jesus... took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you." In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly show our gratitude for such a sublime gift?

We can receive the gift of the Eucharist with the greatest possible reverence and love. And, following our Lord's example, we can give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead.

A Journey Through Grace: Our Pilgrimage to Medjugorje and Rome

We began our pilgrimage on the afternoon of May 18, 2025 leaving behind the familiar hills of Kelowna with hearts full of hope and anticipation. Our destination was not just a place, but a profound encounter with God — through the footsteps of saints, the embrace of Our Lady, and the sacred doors of the Jubilee Year. After a long journey through Calgary, we arrived in Rome on May 19 and were welcomed into the tranquil residence of the Oblate Sisters of the Assumption. It was there our hearts began to quiet, preparing for what was to come.

The next morning, we set out to **Nettuno**, drawn by the love of Sherin's patron saint, **St. Maria Goretti**. Walking through the **Basilica of Our Lady of Graces**, standing near her relics, and learning of her heroic forgiveness stirred something deep within us. Her purity, courage, and the grace that carried her to heaven at such a young age reminded us that holiness is not distant—it is alive, and it calls each one of us.

Medjugorje — The Heart of Our Pilgrimage

On May 21, we flew into **Mostar**, Bosnia, and soon after found ourselves in **Medjugorje**—a town nestled among mountains that reminded us of home, yet radiated a peace not of this world. By evening, we were at **St. James the Greater Church**, enveloped by prayers in dozens of languages, but united in one Spirit. The next morning, we climbed **Apparition Hill**, where Our Lady has appeared since 1981. Later, we made the difficult, even painful ascent up **Cross Mountain**. But something happened along that steep, stony path—something beyond words. We felt as though our burdens were being carried by unseen hands. Our tired legs moved forward, not by strength, but by grace. We reached the summit exhausted but transformed. A divine peace flowed into us, silencing our fears, softening our hearts, and filling us with an unmistakable sense of the **Holy Spirit's presence**.

Later that day, we went to make confession, and it was there we learned the secret of Medjugorje's grace: the local people pray and fast day and night so that God's mercy may never depart from their land. We experienced that mercy firsthand in **confession** and again in **adoration**—a moment of such peace and clarity, it brought tears to our eyes. We left Medjugorje longing to return, feeling as if **Gospa (Our Lady)** herself had taken us into her arms and whispered, "Come back again, my children."

Rome — The Pilgrimage of the Jubilee Doors

Back in Rome on May 23, with spirits renewed, we embraced the path of the **Jubilee Holy Doors**. Using only public transport, we journeyed like pilgrims of old. On May 24, we began with the awe-inspiring **Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major**, followed by **Santa Croce in Gerusalemme**, where relics of Christ's Passion are preserved—the very wood of the Cross, the Holy Nails, and the sign that hung above our Lord. We ended the day at the tomb of **St. Lawrence in San Lorenzo fuori le Mura**, where, by God's mercy, **I experienced physical healing**. It was a miracle that I can only give thanks for.

The next day brought us to the Catacombs of St. Sebastian, the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, and the grand Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls. Our pilgrimage culminated in the most sacred of spaces: the Basilica of St. Peter in the Vatican. Attending Mass there, having passed through each Holy Door, we felt as though Heaven had drawn near.

Assisi — A Gentle Miracle

On May 26, we took a train to **Assisi**, and this day left an indelible mark on our hearts. In the land of **St. Francis and St. Clare**, we were surrounded by peace that can only be described as divine. Learning about **St. Clare and her sister St. Agnes**, and how they loved and served Jesus with unwavering devotion, awakened in us a new hunger to love Christ more deeply. We also visited the tomb of **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, the young modern apostle of the Eucharist. Standing before his simple tomb, we saw the radiant witness of a life totally surrendered to Jesus—even in the age of technology.

On our final day, we visited the **Basilica of St. Catherine of Siena**, where we were inspired by her bold counsel to popes and her profound mysticism. Later, we made our way to the Scala Sancta—the **Holy Stairs** that Jesus ascended during His trial before Pontius Pilate. We climbed them on our knees, step by step, meditating on Christ's Passion. It was humbling and painful, but deeply unifying. With each step, we begged the Lord to strip away our pride and increase our love for Him.

"What no eye has seen..."

"But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him". (1 Corinthians 2:9)

This Scripture became living truth for us. Through basilicas and mountains, through confession and quiet chapels, we glimpsed the **invisible reality of God's love**—radiant, tender, and relentless. We saw the grandeur of our **Catholic Church**: the beauty of her art, the strength of her martyrs, the unity of her saints, and the intimacy of her sacraments. We are **proud to be Catholic**—not with worldly pride, but with humble thanksgiving that we belong to the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

On May 28, our final morning in Rome, we stood among thousands in **St. Peter's Square**, and to our great surprise and joy, we saw **Pope Leo XIV** during the Papal Audience and received his apostolic blessing. It was a fitting end to a pilgrimage of blessings.

A Call to All

We returned to Canada on May 28 - hearts full, souls stirred, and minds awakened. We witnessed miracles. We received grace upon grace. And most of all, we were reminded how much our **Heavenly Mother** loves us, and how real our faith is.

To our beloved parish family: **we invite you**—to find the time to make this pilgrimage. Go to where Our Lady is calling. Walk through the doors of mercy. Climb the mountains of faith. Rest in the arms of Gospa. You will return not just with photos, but with a heart made new.
